ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS

Regulation

1. Title.
2. Form of warrant cards.
3. Surrender of warrant cards.
4. Offences.
5. Consent of Attorney-General.

SCHEDULE.

Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Fire and Rescue Service (Warrant Card) Regulations.

Form of warrant cards.

2.(1) The form of warrant card which may be issued by the Chief Fire Officer to members of the Service shall be that set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The Chief Fire Officer may delete from any warrant card any of the powers specified inside the right cover of such card.

Surrender of warrant cards.

3.(1) If the holder of a warrant card ceases to be a member of the Service or ceases to be a member of the Service authorized to hold a warrant card he shall within seven days of such cessation or on the requirement of the Chief Fire Officer, whichever shall be the earlier, surrender his warrant card to the Chief Fire Officer.

(2) The Chief Fire Officer may at any time whether or not the holder of a warrant card has ceased to be a member of the Service or has ceased to be a member of the Service authorized to hold a warrant card, require the holder of a warrant card to surrender such card for amendment or withdrawal and the holder of the warrant card so required shall thereupon surrender his warrant card to the Chief Fire Officer forthwith.

(3) A person who neglects or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this regulation is guilty of an offence and is liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of £25.

Offences.

4. A person who—

- (a) uses a warrant card for any purpose not being the person to whom such warrant card was issued;
- (b) being the holder of a warrant card knowingly uses such warrant card for any purpose not being a purpose authorized by such card;
- (c) having ceased to be a member of the Service or having ceased to be a member of the Service authorized to hold a warrant card, uses a warrant card for any purpose whether or not at the time of such use he is guilty of an offence under regulation 3; or

- (d) having been required to surrender his warrant card by the Chief Fire Officer and having failed to do so thereafter uses such card for any purpose,

is guilty of an offence and is liable, on summary conviction, to imprisonment for three months and to a fine of £100.

Consent of Attorney-General.

5. No prosecution for an offence against these Regulations shall be commenced without the consent in writing of the Attorney-General.
