**BURUNDI (TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS) (AMENDMENT NO.3)
REGULATIONS 2018**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 52A of the Immigration, Asylum and Refugee Act, for the purpose of implementing Council Decision (CFSP) 2018/1612 of 25 October 2018 concerning restrictive measures in view of the situation in Burundi, the Minister has made the following Regulations-

Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Burundi (Travel Restrictions) (Amendment) (No.3) Regulations 2018.

Commencement.

2. These Regulations come into operation on the day of publication.

Amendment to the Burundi (Travel Restrictions) Regulations 2015.

3. The Burundi (Travel Restrictions) Regulations 2015 is amended in the following manner -

- (a) in the Schedule, Article 6 is amended by substituting “31 October 2018” with “31 October 2019”; and
- (b) in the Annex, by substituting the entry for Mathias/Joseph NIYONZIMA alias KAZUNGU” with-
