**AN ORDINANCE** to amend the Imports and Exports Ordinance 1986.

**ENACTED** by the Legislature of Gibraltar.

**1. Title and commencement.**

This Ordinance may be cited as the Imports and Exports (Amendment) Ordinance 1995 and shall come into effect on such day as the Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, appoint and different days may be so appointed for different purposes.

**2. Amendment to section 2.**

4 of 1995 *Imports and Exports (Amendment) Ordinance, 1995*

---

Section 2 of the Imports and Exports Ordinance 1986 (hereinafter called “the principal Ordinance”) is amended in sub-section (1) by inserting after the definition of “sell” the following new definition —

““Scheduled Substance” means any substance appearing for the time being in Schedule 4 to the Drugs (Misuse) Ordinance;”.

**3. Amendment to section 15.**

Section 15 of the principal Ordinance is amended —

- (a) by inserting after the word “drug” where it occurs for the first time the words “or Scheduled Substance”;
- (b) by omitting the fullstop at the end of paragraph (b) (ii) and substituting therefor a semi-colon;
- (c) by inserting the following new paragraph —

“(c) where it is a Scheduled Substance -

- (i) on summary conviction to a fine at level 4 on the standard scale and to imprisonment for six months;
- (ii) on conviction on indictment to a fine of such amount as the Court may determine and to imprisonment for five years.”.

**4. Amendment to section 80.**

Section 80 of the principal Ordinance is amended —

- (a) by inserting after the word “drug” where it occurs for the first time the words “or Scheduled Substance”;
- (b) by omitting the fullstop at the end of paragraph (b) (ii) and substituting therefor a semi-colon;

(c) by inserting the following new paragraph (c) —

“(c) where it is a Scheduled Substance —

- (i) on summary conviction to a fine at level 4 on the standard scale and to imprisonment for six months;
- (ii) on conviction on indictment to a fine of such amount as the Court may determine and to imprisonment for five years.”.

#### **EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM**

The object of this Bill is to amend the Imports and Exports Ordinance 1986 and to give, in part, effect to the Vienna Convention.
