LICENSING AND FEES ACT.

LICENSING AND FEES (AMENDMENT) NOTICE, 1989.

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 52 of the Licensing and Fees Act, and of all other enabling powers, the Governor, with the prior approval of the House of Assembly, has issued the following notice:

Title.

1. This Notice may be cited as the Licensing and Fees (Amendment) Notice, 1989.

Amendment of Item 4.

2. Item 4 of Schedule 2 to the Licensing and Fees Act is amended by substituting £4, £8 and £2 for £2, £5 and £1 respectively.

New Item 5.

3. Item 5 of Schedule 2 to the said Act is revoked and the following Item is substituted therefor

"5. PASSPORT FEES.

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| (a) For the issue of a passport valid for one period of ten years | £15 |
| (b) For the issue of a collective passport | £30 |
| (c) For the issue of an emergency passport or a certificate of identity or the acceptance of a declaration of identity | £5 |
| (d) For amending an existing passport by amending the holder's name at the request of the holder, or issuing a replacement passport which contains such amendment | £ 7.50 |

(e) For amending an existing passport by adding a fresh photograph or amending the holder's description, or issuing a replacement passport which contains such amendment, except where the holder was under 16 years at the date of issue £ 7.50

(f) For amending an existing passport by adding the particulars of a child or children £ 4

(g) For checking or forwarding, or both, an application for the issue of a passport by an authority of Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom £ 4

(h) For urgent passport facilities where at the request of the applicant, it is necessary to provide passport facilities urgently, a fee of £27.50 shall be payable, in addition to any fees payable under paragraphs (a) to (g) (inclusive) £27.50

Note

The passport officer may remit the fee payable under this paragraph where the application is made as a matter of urgency because of bereavement or serious illness, or in any case of hardship

(i) (1) Receiving an application for -

(i) entry clearance (other than for the United Kingdom or a dependency of the United Kingdom) £10

(ii) entry clearance for a dependency of the United Kingdom" £ 5

in addition to the fee applicable to such clearance under paragraph (j) below

(2) Preparing or forwarding, or both, any letter, certificate, declaration or other document which may be required by, an authority of Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, a dependency of the United Kingdom, or any other country or territory for or in connection with an application, for the issue or renewal of a residence permit, identity card, application for registration or naturalisation or forwarding any other certificate or document (except a Home Office travel document), in addition to the fees payable for

such documents under the Immigration Control Act, the Civilian Registration Act and Item 3 of this Schedule £ 5

Receiving an application for an entry clearance, certificate of entitlement to the right of abode or a confirmation of the right of abode in or for the United Kingdom £60

Unless

(2) the applicant seeks entry clearance for employment or self-employment for a period of six months or less, or as a returning resident, visitor, student, passenger in transit, "au pair" or for a working holiday, in which case, the fee is –

(i) for one entry £20

(ii) for two entries £30

or

(iii) for multiple entries £44

or such sums, (being the equivalent of fees charged by the authorities of any State for receiving or granting an application for an entry clearance to a British Citizen), as the Secretary of State, with the consent of the Treasury, directs to be taken for receiving or granting an application for an entry clearance from a national or citizen of that state."

Amendment of Item 8.

4. Item 8 of Schedule 2 is amended in Part II by substituting "£15", "£50" and "£30" for "£10", "£30" and "£20" respectively.
