Title.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Medical (Group Practice Scheme) Regulations.

Interpretation.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, –

“Authority” means the Gibraltar Health Authority;

“entitled person” means a person entitled to benefits under the Scheme by virtue of the provisions of section 3 of the Act or by virtue of paragraphs (d) or (e) of Rule 2 of the Hospital Rules;

“General Manager” means the General Manager of the Gibraltar Health Authority.

“normal hours” means –

- (i) in Government Surgeries 9 a.m.–1 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. to 5.30 p. m, on Mondays to Fridays; 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturdays;
- (ii) for house visits 8 a. m.–7 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays; 8 a.m.– 1 p.m., on Saturdays.

Free treatment under Social Security(Employment injuries Insurance) Act.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations an entitled person shall not be liable to pay the fees prescribed by these regulations in respect of treatment to which he is entitled free of charge under the provisions of section 30 of the Social Security (Employment Injuries Insurance) Act.

Entitlement to registration.

4.(1) The classes of persons prescribed in Schedule I shall be entitled to be registered as members of the Scheme

(2) Persons registered under this regulation by virtue of coming within Part I of Schedule 1 may not be required to pay the annual fee prescribed by section 5(3) of the Act.

Registration.

5.(1) Every person who is insured under the Social Security (Employment Injuries Insurance) Act or the Social Security (Insurance) Act shall apply for registration by completing and returning the form set out in Schedule 2.

(2) Every person who is entitled to be registered under the provisions of regulation 4(1) shall, if he wishes to be so registered, complete and return to the Authority the form set out in Schedule 2:

Provided that in the case of persons entitled to be registered by reason of being entitled to treatment under the District Medical Scheme the Authority may register and issue medical cards to such persons without the form being completed.

Payment on registration.

6.(1) Every person who is registered under the provisions of regulation 4, by reason of being included in Part II of Schedule 1, shall within 14 days after being notified of such registration pay the appropriate sum.

(2) The appropriate sum shall be reduced by one twelfth for each completed month that has expired, since the 1st day of January in each year, before the person is notified that his application for registration has been accepted.

(3) The Authority may, where he is satisfied that payment of the appropriate sum in one amount would cause hardship, allow its payment by quarterly instalments.

(4) For the purposes of this regulation, the appropriate sum means the annual fee for the time being specified in section 5(3) of the Act that is payable by the person registered.

Exemption.

6A. There shall be exempted from the payment of the annual fee prescribed under section 5(3) of the Act and from the payment of the registration fee prescribed under regulation 6, any person registered under the provisions of regulation 4 by reason of being included in Part II of Schedule 1 who satisfies the General Manager, that his annual income is less than such amount as the Governor may from time to time determine:

Provided that the Governor may in his discretion in special and deserving cases remit or waive any fees payable under this regulation.

Medical Cards.

7. Every registered person shall be issued with a medical card in the appropriate form set out in Schedule 4.

Medical treatment.

8.(1) An entitled person shall receive out-patients treatment in a Government surgery during normal hours and may be visited in his home as often as is, in the opinion of a doctor rendering services under the Scheme, required.

(2) Subject to the provisions of sub-regulation (3) there shall be paid to the doctor in respect of each visit to a Government surgery for treatment and in respect of each visit to an entitled person's home by a doctor, the fees specified in Schedule 3.

(3) No fees shall be payable under this regulation by persons specified in Part I of Schedule 1 or by any person to whom the exemption provided for in regulation 6A applies.

(4) Fees payable under this regulation shall be paid at the time of the visit.

(5) A person seeking treatment whether at home or in a Government surgery shall at the time of the visit to or by a doctor produce a medical card showing him to be entitled to benefit under the Scheme.

Insurance stamps.

9.(1) A contribution payable under the Act by and in respect of an employed person shall be made by the employer affixing to the insurance card of such person a single stamp in respect of the contributions payable under the Social Security (Employment Injuries Insurance) Act and the Social Security (Insurance) Act (if any) and the contribution due under the Act.

(2) A contribution payable under the Act by a self employed person or a voluntary contributor under the Social Security (Insurance) Act shall be made by the insured person affixing to his insurance card a single stamp in respect of the contributions due under the Social Security (Insurance) Act and the Act.

Reference for consultation, etc.

10. (1) Entitled persons who are referred by a doctor under the Scheme for consultation, pathological or radiological investigation shall not be required to pay the fees prescribed under the Hospitals Rules.

(2) Entitled persons who are referred by a doctor under the Scheme for admission to hospital for general in-patient treatment shall not be required to pay the fees prescribed under the provisions of the Hospitals Rules.

Medicines.

11. (1) Subject to the provisions of sub-regulation (2) an entitled person shall receive, free of charge, medicines on any prescription issued to him by a doctor under the Scheme provided that such medicine is made up and supplied by a Scheme pharmacist.

(2) There shall be paid by an entitled person in respect of every prescription issued the sum of £1.20 for each item on such prescription:

Provided that in the case of a person registered by virtue of the provisions of Part I of Schedule 1 or a person to whom the exemption provided for in regulation 6A applies, no sum shall be payable.

(3) For the purpose of this regulation "Scheme pharmacist" means a pharmacist who has entered into an agreement with Government to make up and supply prescriptions under the Scheme.

Hospital treatment.

12. Entitled persons shall receive hospital treatment at the rates prescribed in the Hospitals Rules.

SCHEDULE 1.

1. Persons entitled to medical attention and treatment under the District Medical Scheme.

PART II.

1. All persons, ordinarily resident in Gibraltar, other than members of the permanent cadre of the Gibraltar Regiment who are neither required to be registered under the provisions of section 4(1) of the Act or specified in Part I of this Schedule.

Determination made under reg. 6A.

DETERMINATION.

1 January 1980

Pursuant to regulation 6A of the Medical (Group Practice Scheme) Regulations, the Government has determined that with effect from the 1st day of January, 1980, the amount of a person's annual income for the purposes of exemption under that regulation shall be—

- (a) in the case of a married person, the aggregate of the annual amount payable by way of old age pension under the Social Security (Insurance) Act at the full rate for a married couple; and
- (b) in the case of a single person, the annual amount payable by way of old age pension under that Act at the full rate for a single person.
