Public Health (Offensive Trades) Rules 1990

ARRANGEMENT OF RULES

Rule

1. Title.
2. Application.
3. Prevention and limitation of noxious or injurious effects.

Title.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Public Health (Offensive Trades) Rules 1990.

Application.

2. These Rules apply to any trade, business or manufacture declared to be an offensive trade by the Public Health (Offensive Trades) Order 1990 or any amendment thereto.

Prevention and limitation of noxious or injurious effects.

3. No trade, business or manufacture to which these rules apply, shall be established or operated, unless—
 - (a) the Government is satisfied and continues to be satisfied that in respect of that trade business or manufacture, the requirements of European Economic Community Directive 84/360 of June 28 1984. and any amendments thereto (“the Directive”) are met and that any measure fixing emission limit values pursuant to Article 8 of the Directive are complied with;
 - (b) all such monitoring of specification, design and operation as may be necessary to comply with the Directive, or to furnish evidence of compliance, in respect of that trade business or manufacture has been completed or is being undertaken by a person operating or intending to operate or seeking consent to establish or operate such trade business or manufacture.
 - (c) the Government has been or is being provided with any and all information it has or shall request in respect of that trade, business or manufacture, as is, in the opinion of the Government, necessary to establish compliance with the requirements of the Directive; and
 - (d) any application for consent to, and any consent granted for, the establishment of any trade to which these rules apply shall have been published in a Government Notice in the Gazette.
