PUBLIC HEALTH (POLLUTION OF THE AQUATIC
ENVIRONMENT) REGULATIONS, 1994

Title and commencement.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Health (Pollution of the Aquatic Environment) Regulations 1994 and shall come into effect 30 days after the day of publication.

Interpretation and Application.

2. (1) In these Regulations, unless the context shall otherwise require, “the Act” means the Public Health Act.

(2) The amendments made by these Regulations to the provisions of the Act shall apply to any trade, business or manufacture established, or being carried on, on or after the day on which these Regulations are effective:

Provided that where the competent authority designated by the Government in accordance with section 95 of the Act, as amended by these regulations, is satisfied that—

- (a) a trade, business or manufacture to which section 94(1)(b) of the Act, as amended by these Regulations, applies was established on the effective day and was being carried on on that day; and
- (b) an application has been made to the authority in accordance with rules made under section 95 of the Act, as amended by these regulations, for an authorisation in respect of that trade, business or manufacture,

it shall not be an offence to carry on that trade, business or manufacture for a period not exceeding 30 days from the day on which these Regulations are effective by virtue of regulation 1 (or such longer period not exceeding 60 days as the competent authority may in its discretion permit).

Regulation 6 amends section 94 of the Act.

Regulation 7 amends section 95 of the Act.
