SOCIAL SECURITY (EMPLOYMENT INJURIES INSURANCE) ACT

EMPLOYMENT INJURIES (BENEFITS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1987

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 50 of the Social Security (Employment Injuries Insurance) Act, and of all other enabling powers, the Governor has made the following regulations:

Title and commencement.

1.(1) These regulations may be cited as the Employment Injuries (Benefits) (Amendment) Regulations 1987.

(2) These regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of January 1988.

Amendment of regulation 4.

2. Regulation 4 of the Employment Injuries (Benefits) Regulations (hereinafter called the principal regulations) is amended:

(a) in paragraph (a), by omitting the expression "£17.00" and substituting the expression "£18.20".

(b) in paragraph (b), by omitting the expression "£34.00" and substituting the expression "£36.40".

Amendment of Regulation 8.

3. Regulation 8(b) of the principal regulations is amended by omitting the expression "£22.30" and substituting the expression "£23.90".

Replacement of schedule 2.

4. The principal regulations are further amended by revoking Schedule 2, and substituting the following Schedule:

Saving.

5.(1) The amendment effected to the principal regulations by regulations 3 and 4 of these regulations shall not apply in respect of any accident or successive accidents (as the case may be) occurring before the 1st day of January, 1988.

(2) The increased rate of disablement pension under section 16 of 'the Act shall be payable irrespective of the date of the accident.
