# SOCIAL SECURITY (NON-CONTRIBUTORY BENEFITS AND UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE) ORDINANCE (AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE 3) ORDER 2004

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 18(2) of the Social Security (Non-Contributory Benefits and Unemployment Insurance) Ordinance and following approval by Resolution of the House of Assembly, the Governor has made the following Order—

#### Title and commencement.

1. This Order may be cited as the Social Security (Non-Contributory Benefits and Unemployment Insurance) (Amendment of Schedule 3) Order 2004 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 12 July 2004.

#### Amendment of Schedule 3.
