UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE)
(AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE 3) ORDER 2011**

In exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 18(2) of the Social Security (Non-Contributory Benefits and Unemployment Insurance) Act, on considering the advice of the Minister with responsibility for social affairs, and following approval by Resolution of the Gibraltar Parliament, the Government has made the following Order—

Title and commencement.

1. This Order may be cited as the Social Security (Non-Contributory Benefits and Unemployment Insurance) (Amendment of Schedule 3) Order 2011 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1 July 2011.

Amendment of Schedule 3.

2. For Schedule 3, Parts I and I(A) there shall be substituted the following Schedule—
