SOCIAL SECURITY (CLOSED LONG-TERM BENEFITS AND SCHEME) ACT, 1996

SOCIAL SECURITY (CLOSED LONG-TERM BENEFITS AND SCHEME) (AMENDMENT OF BENEFITS) REGULATIONS, 2011

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 38 of the Social Security (Closed Long-Term Benefits and Scheme) Act, 1996, the Minister with responsibility for social affairs has made the following Regulations—

Title and commencement.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Social Security (Closed Long-Term Benefits and Scheme) (Amendment of Benefits) Regulations, 2011 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1 April 2011.

Amendment of Section 16(a).

2. Section 16(a) of the Social Security (Closed Long-Term Benefits and Scheme) Act, 1996 ("the Act") is amended by omitting "£192.68" and substituting "£199.42".

Amendment of Schedule 1.

3. Schedule 1 to the Act is amended by omitting Part 1, and substituting the following Part-
