Title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Services Vehicles Exemption Order.

Exemption.

2. The vehicles specified in column 1 of the Schedule, being the property of, or for the time being under the control of, the Ministry of Defence or the Property Services Agency shall be exempted from the requirements of the Vehicles (Construction, Equipment and Maintenance) Regulations respectively specified opposite thereto in column 2 of the Schedule:

Provided that whenever it is proposed to use any such vehicles which do not comply with the requirements of the regulations, upon any road or bridge vested in the Governor reasonable notice shall be given to the Government of the date and time when the vehicle or vehicles are intended to be so used and of the route proposed to be followed thereby:

Provided also that nothing in this paragraph shall be construed as applying to vehicles belonging to or used by any person or contractor executing works for or on behalf of the Ministry of Defence or the Department of the Environment.
