**MOTOR VEHICLES TEST REGULATIONS 1987
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2001**

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 4B and 4C of the Traffic Act, the Governor has made the following Regulations-

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles Test Regulations 1987 (Amendment) Regulations 2001.

Amendment to the Motor Vehicles Test Regulations 1987.

2. The Motor Vehicles Test Regulations 1987 shall be amended in regulation 37 by substituting for sub-regulation (1) the following sub-regulations-

“(1) Subject to sub-regulation (1A) and (1B), a roadworthiness certificate issued in respect of a motor vehicle or trailer shall be valid for a period not exceeding 14 months.

(1A) A roadworthiness certificate issued in respect of a motor vehicle or trailer shall expire either-

- (a) on the anniversary of the date when a roadworthiness certificate was first required in accordance with the provisions of the Motor Vehicle Test Regulations 1987 in respect of a vehicle; or
- (b) in the case of a motor vehicle that has previously been presented for roadworthiness testing in accordance with the provisions of the Motor Vehicle Test Regulations 1987, on the anniversary of the date of expiration of the previous roadworthiness certificate issued in respect thereof.

(1B) Where, in accordance with regulation 7, the roadworthiness of a vehicle is tested prior to the expiry of the roadworthiness certificate then in its currency (hereinafter "the first certificate"), the Chief Examiner shall revoke the first certificate and issue a subsequent certificate with a period of validity extended by a period of time equal to the time left to run in the first certificate prior to its revocation."
